#### (2) Exemptions of School Fees

#### 7 Student Loans and Scholarships

Various educational financial support systems are offered for students in need. There are student loans that require repayment and scholarships. Decisions are made by taking into consideration of the financial status of the family and students' school records.

#### (1) National Grant

• • • For students whose guardians are living in Saitama Prefecture. Submit applications to schools.

#### **Repayment is required after graduation.**

②A Subsidy to Support Parents of Private School Students

• • For students living in Saitama prefecture and attending private schools within Saitama. Submit applications to schools. No repayment is needed after graduation.

#### (3) Municipal Scholarship

Some municipalities provide scholarships. Please ask municipal offices for information.
