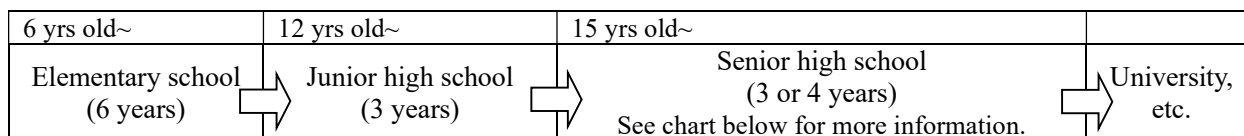
1 Senior High Schools in the Japanese Educational System

Students generally attend senior high school for 3 to 4 years after graduating from junior high school.

Unlike elementary and junior high schools, students must pass an exam to enter senior high school.

Even after you enter high school, you may not be able to proceed to the next grade or graduate if you don't do well in your studies.

High schools also offer various club activities and events throughout the year (such as excursions, sports festivals, school festivals, and school trips).



*Students born in April through to March of the following year are in the same school grade.

(*1) Specialist Courses: Agricultural, Industrial, Commercial, and Foreign Language studies (etc.)

(*2) Comprehensive Courses: In addition to compulsory subjects, you can also choose to study both standard and specialist subjects.

(*3) You can study both standard and specialist subjects (such as Welfare, Business, International Studies, Natural Science, etc.) under the credit system.

(2) Private High Schools (schools that are not public high schools)

There are full-time and correspondence schools. Please contact individual schools for more information about what they offer.

3 School Information Sessions

Each school will run an information session. We recommend that students attend these sessions to see the school and ask questions to help them decide which school they want to apply to. There are also joint school information sessions where you can get information about multiple schools. (Schedule subject to change.)

4 Entrance Examinations

Eligibility Criteria	<p>① Students who have graduated from junior high school in Japan or overseas OR students who are expected to graduate in March 2025.</p> <p>② Students who have not graduated from junior high school but can demonstrate academic abilities at the junior high school graduate level.</p> <p>*A “Qualification Certificate” (<i>Shutsugan Shikaku Nintei</i>) is required for students who are not graduates of a junior high school in Japan. 5 Students who are not Graduates of a Junior High School in Japan

A “Qualification Certificate” (*shutsugan shikaku nintei*) is required to take entrance examinations when applying to public senior high schools (prefectural and municipal).

***Important:** Please consult the Private School Affairs Group (*gakuji tantou*) of the Prefectural School Management and Personnel Division, Saitama Prefectural Education Bureau before applying.

If applying to private schools, please contact each individual school.

6 Special Selection Process for Non-Japanese Students

The following 12 schools offer exams for non-Japanese students who have only lived in Japan for a short period of time.

Senior High Schools Offering Special Selection Process for Non-Japanese Students

Iwatsuki HS (Standard/International Culture Course), Kawaguchi Higashi HS (Standard), Kawagoe Nishi HS (Standard), Kurihashi Hokusai HS (Standard), Soka Minami HS (Standard/Foreign Language Course), Niiza Yanase HS (Standard), Nanryo HS (Standard/Foreign Language Course), Fukaya Daiichi HS (Standard), Misato Kita HS (Standard), Menuma HS (Standard), Wako Kokusai HS (Standard/Foreign Language Course), Warabi HS (Standard/Foreign Language Course)

(1) Eligibility Criteria

- The student has lived in Japan for less than three years in total (as at February 1, 2025)
- Both the student and their guardian live in Saitama Prefecture, or intend to live in Saitama by March 31, 2025

(2) Information about the Entrance Examination

The entrance exam will consist of an academic examination (math and English) and interview.

*Examination questions will be the same as the standard Japanese exams with furigana added above kanji. Interviews will be conducted in Japanese.

*There is a possibility that you will not be accepted if your examination results do not meet the standard, even if there are few applicants.

8 Financial Support Systems for School Expenses

There are various financial support systems available for senior high school students. Some require repayment and some do not. Eligibility for these systems is determined by the family's financial situation and a recommendation from the student's school.

(1) Supports Systems that do not Require Repayment

- High School Tuition Support Fund (for students attending senior high school)
- Saitama Prefecture Assistance for Parents of Private High School Students (for students who live in Saitama Prefecture with their guardians, and are attending a private senior high school in Saitama Prefecture)
- Saitama Prefecture Allowance for High School Education (student's guardian must live in Saitama Prefecture)

(2) Support Systems that Require Repayment

- Loan for High School Education in Saitama Prefecture (student's guardian must live in Saitama Prefecture)

(3) Other (Municipal Student Loans and Scholarships, etc.)

- Some municipalities may have scholarships or loans available. Please contact your municipal office for more information.
- Some schools also offer a reduction in enrollment and miscellaneous fees. Please consult with teachers at your senior high school prior to or soon after enrolling.
